	The potential risks will be addressed by a comprehensive and extensive consultation with the European and Uzbek partners before the start of the project, and during the first months of the project implementation, focusing on understanding the context, specific needs, tasks and priorities of the involved stakeholders. Due to the complex management structure of the UZDOC 2.0 project, it is crucial to set clear responsibilities for each project partners. The consultations and discussions will be supported by the English speaking key

intercommunications training will be performed, targeted primarily at the new project partners, explaining the methodology of a EU funded projects, expectations and obligations from each partner, reducing the risk of misunderstanding and potential difficulties in the implementation of the project.

The possible risks will also be mitigated using experience and contacts established during previous project and visits to Uzbekistan, which have allowed for better alignment of key ideas and concepts among consortium members.

Aims and objectives of the work package:

The goal of this work package is to gather all the critical information required for the smooth implementation of the project and to create a work plan containing detailed strategy on how to proceed with the project implementation. During the making of the project, it was expected that some specific information, stakeholders' opinions, context and possible obstacles could not be identified in fullness, and that more preparation would be needed when the project starts. Reasons for this lie in the size of the consortium and the particularity of the involved stakeholders, and also the communication challenges between European and Uzbek partners. Furthermore, the criteria for selecting the participants in the training events (supervisors training, doctoral candidates training, job shadowing) needs to be decided, so that further activities could be prepared.

Therefore, this work package has two objectives:

Objective 1. To discuss and to present the project objectives to the Uzbek HE stakeholders and project partners during the 2-day stocktaking meeting in Uzbekistan (project Month 2), and to collect input on the specificity of the local context at the partner Uzbek HEIs which critical for the project implementation, and could not have been fully identified and embraced during the project design phase.

Description

Aim of the stocktaking meeting is to receive feedback from the participants on the two goals of the project which rely mostly on the input from Uzbekistan stakeholders, and thus to address the possible risk factors in their implementation:

a) Establishment of Joint Doctoral Centre (JDC)

The general agreement on the necessity of the formation of JDC exists and was confirmed during the previous project implemented by UNICA in Uzbekistan, and also during the meetings with Uzbek stakeholders during the design of this project. Nonetheless, the specific situations on each Uzbek partner HEIs regarding the introduction of the new structures in doctoral education is very different due to their size, capacities and current stage in the development/implementation of reforms. A Consortium needs to discuss the necessary steps, identify possible obstacles and propose the solutions in order to successfully start a JDC and integrate it within the existing system of Uzbek doctoral education. Furthermore, concrete information required for the functioning of the JDC – number of staff, modes of participation of JDC in the implementation of the UZDOC 2.0 project activities – needs to be gathered, discussed and included in the optimized work plan.

b) Exercise in the designing a model of a new joint doctoral programme

UZDOC 2.0 project will start an exercise (simulation) in the designing a model of a new, joint doctoral programme, using quality assurance recommendations developed during the previous project. It is important to have a clear understanding of the legal and regulatory framework within which this exercise can be conducted, so that the exercise provides best possible results. Consultation with the key stakeholders during the stocktaking meeting is crucial in realization of this project result, since Uzbek doctoral education system is strongly centralized and regulated and it allows for only limited adjustment of existing programmes and curriculum management.

Outcome of the stocktaking meeting will be the optimized project work plan based on the received input and using the expertise and experience of participating institutions and all parties involved.

Objective 2. Since the UZDOC 2.0 project has the goal to contribute to the raise of the quality of doctoral education in the whole Uzbekistan, awareness raising campaign aimed at the HE stakeholders and Uzbek HEIs (included and those not included in the consortium) will begin with organizing and performing a 2-day round table in Tashkent (project Month 2) on the topic of benefits of structured support for a doctoral education in Uzbekistan.

During the round table, experts from Uzbekistan and Europe (both from the consortium and external experts) will provide support to Uzbek HEIs in facing the challenges of improving the quality of doctoral education by introducing innovative quality assurance elements in doctoral training, and familiarizing the Uzbek participants with the European trends in institutional responsibility, accountability in doctoral education and research integrity.

Roles of partners:

WP1 will be led by TFI (P6), supported by UNICA (P1). All the other partners will be extensively involved in the project preparation phase by contributing in the discussions, providing their input and expertise and participating in the stocktaking meeting and round tables. Contribution of Uzbek partners will be of great value in this phase of the project implementation, by providing information for the following phase of the project (criteria for selecting the participants of training events, input for quality assurance plan, dissemination and exploitation plans, selecting the members of PMB and ULCB, functioning of the Joint Doctoral Centre etc.)

and policy making in the higher education institutions, who will be informed on the content and invited to the stocktaking meeting (Uzbek Ministry of Higher education, State Attestation Committee, Academy of Science, Cabinet of Ministers etc.) Emphasis will be placed on considerations of the formal and legal requirements for running and integrating Joint Doctoral Centre into the existing system in order to assure its sustainability. Clear explanations of activities, duties, composition, responsibilities and authority of the JDC, and the number and type of human resources required to maintain it, will be the central part of this deliverable in order to Integrate the JDC into the existing university structures. At the same time, it will allow for avoiding any possible overlapping with other services for doctoral candidates that already exist and to provide a functional, workable JDC, which will be able to operate and serve as a platform for implementing other project goals. Additionally, concrete new approaches and tools for quality assurance in Uzbek system of doctoral education will be discussed. Proposed tool for integrating new QA recommendations and mechanisms is the exercise in the designing of a model of new, joint doctoral programme. During the stocktaking meeting, preparations will be made (content, structure, task distribution, responsibilities of participants, methodology etc.) in order to start this exercise in Month 11 of the project (see Deliverable 2.5 for more information). A result of the stocktaking meeting will be the optimized project work plan with respect to the steps needed to be taken in order to achieve main project goals. Optimization of the wok plan will be the responsibility of the work package leader and the Project Coordinator based on the new relevant information gained during the stocktaking meeting. The draft of the detailed work plan will be presented, discussed and approved at the 1st Consortium meeting in Tashkent and will be available for all the partners on the project website. The work plan will be finalized by UNICA (P1) at the end of the third project month and approved by all the consortium members using electronic means of communications.
